Participate in Southwest Area Study 2018



The Town is partnering with NC Capital Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (CAMPO) to update the Southwest Area Study (SWAS) transportation plan in cooperation with partners that include Wake County, Harnett County, Apex, Angier, Holly Springs and other transportation agencies.

This project will ultimately lay out a long-term vision for a multi-modal transportation network in southwestern Wake and northeastern Harnett counties, with a detailed implementation strategy that includes short-term and mid-term recommendations to aid with the implementation of a long-term vision.

Currently, SWAS is gathering public input to understand the community priorities and make recommendations about how to improve the transportation system for everyone in our area. This summer SWAS will identify problem areas and formulate solutions this fall. In early 2019, SWAS will set priorities with a final report including recommendations coming in spring 2019.

New Water and Sewer Rates

Current utility invoices will begin reflecting an increase in water and sewer rates because of increased water cost from suppliers, as well as the utility rate study recommendations adopted three years ago that are tied to the expansion of Terrible Creek Wastewater Treatment Plant.



The water base rate will increase by \$0.20 per month and the water consumption rate will increase by \$0.10 per thousand gallons. The sewer base rate will increase by \$0.54 per month and the sewer consumption rate will increase by \$0.23 per thousand gallons. The average residential customer using 5,000 gallons of water per month will see an increase of \$2.39 per month to their water and sewer utility bill.
