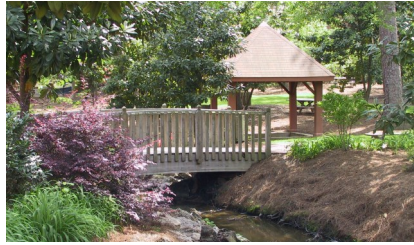


Town Project Updates

Fuquay Mineral Spring Park

Work to stabilize the banks of the stream located in Fuquay Mineral Spring Park will begin in mid-September thanks to a grant from the Golden LEAF Foundation. The bank received major damage as a result of Hurricane Matthew and is located near two major roads, Spring Street and U.S. 401. The grant for \$338,400 will fund 60% of the project expenses with the remainder funded by the Town. Fuquay Mineral Spring Park will remain open during construction, which is anticipated to last 120 days, however, Spring Street will be partially closed as a construction staging area.



Old Honeycutt Road & Purfoy Road Intersection

In early Oct., construction will begin to improve the intersection at Old Honeycutt Road and Purfoy Road. Turning lanes will be added to three of the approaches and signals will be updated accordingly. The total project is expected to cost \$1,218,500 of which a Locally Administered Project Program grant from the Capital Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (CAMPO) will fund 75% of the cost or \$913,875. The Town of Fuquay-Varina will provide \$304,625 or 25% of the total project cost to be paid from bond proceeds. The project should take 180 days and should finish spring 2020.

Get into the #9 pmRoutine



Have you seen or heard about the #9pmRoutine on the Fuquay-Varina's Facebook page? It's become popular and simple! The #9pmRoutine is a way for the public to protect their home, cars and other property. Every night at 9:00 p.m., the Fuquay-Varina Police Department encourages the community,

through a humorous meme or photo on Facebook, to lock up property, turn on lights and bring in valuables to reduce the likelihood of falling victim to property crimes.

Applying the #9pmRoutine removes the opportunity for thieves to steal your property and commit other crimes. It only takes less than a minute to open an unlocked car and steal property. Help the police department prevent crime by taking a few extra minutes to check your property to ensure it is secure before bedtime.

While the #9pmRoutine campaign will not stop crime by itself, it's a valuable outreach program. The Fuquay-Varina Police Department receives positive feedback from the community. We have found that people expect to see a reminder every night at 9 p.m. to lock up.

As well we do not want the public to think that crime only happens at night. We want the public to take preventive measures all day, every day. It's about applying crime prevention measures consistently to help create a safer Fuquay-Varina.
