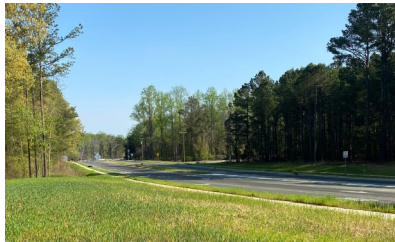

NW Judd Parkway to Open Early-May

NW Judd Parkway, which completes the Judd Parkway Loop, will open in early-May. The project consists of 1.8 miles of new roadway with four lanes divided by median and provides bike lanes and pedestrian sidewalks. "Judd Parkway is the most critical plan our town has for moving traffic effectively around town," stated Mayor John W. Byrne, "This new section allows citizens to bypass a great deal of



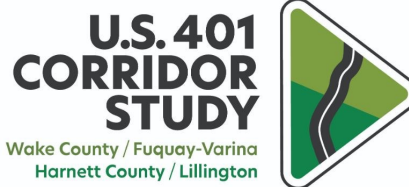

traffic and will alleviate pressure points at places like Wake Chapel Road, Ennis Street and the Judd/Main Intersection." The project also includes an intersection relocation for Wilbon Road with new roadway and an extension of Washington Street to the new roadway affording improved access to the Lincoln Heights neighborhood.

The project is paid for through a combination of financing including \$8.65 million in Locally Administered Projects Program Grant Funding with the remainder paid from bonds approved by taxpayers in the 2015 Transportation Bond.

U.S. 401 Corridor Study Includes Fuquay-Varina

The Capital Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (CAMPO) is conducting a corridor study of U.S. 401. This study is approximately 19 miles of the U.S. 401 Corridor from Banks Road in Wake County through the Town of Fuquay-Varina to the N.C. 210 and U.S. 421 intersection



near the Town of Lillington in Harnett County; and about seven miles for the proposed U.S. 401 Bypass. This study will build off previous studies in the area. It will focus on planning and design for the study area to determine the proposed ultimate cross-section and alignment of U.S. 401 by developing a vision for the study area, analyzing short- and long-term solutions, and developing realistic, implementable, and prioritized projects.

This Study affects Fuquay-Varina residents and is estimated to take about two years to complete. Public involvement is key to a successful project that ensures study recommendations will meet the needs of the entire community. You are invited to participate in study engagement activities to help shape the recommendations by learning about the planning process and providing your input. News from Parks & Recreation (PRCR)

Excuse our mess at James A. Campbell Park! The Town is installing a small restroom facility which should be completed by late summer.

A construction contract has been awarded to Vortex Construction in the amount of \$412,556 to renovate the Clubhouse building at Hilltop Needmore Town Park & Preserve. The renovation will include changing the building use to a community hall with kitchen, office, restrooms, and approximately 1,500 square feet of event space on the first floor. There will be no work on the second floor. Renovation includes bringing the clubhouse up to current building code for public use and providing ADA accessibility improvements. The renovated building will be used to provide additional PRCR programming. Construction should begin in May and is anticipated to be completed by the end of 2021.
