Fuquay-Varina is growing quickly! The Town has over 30 transportation projects that are recently completed, actively under construction, or planned for the near future. The Town Board has approved \$45 million in road projects that have been recently completed or are currently being designed, acquiring Right-of-Way, or actively under construction.



Planning, project design and right-of-way acquisition must all occur prior to construction with various state and federal approvals during the process. Depending on the size of the project and associated complexities, the pre-construction phase for proposed bond projects normally takes 12 - 24 months.

It's a lot for citizens to keep up with! That's why we designed a Transportation Project Page to make it easier to navigate the Transportation Projects taking place in Fuquay-Varina. The Full Transportation List is divided into Recently Completed, New Projects and Future Projects. Under each project, find details with a description of the project and its status, contractor information (if any), project costs and funding sources, and a map detailing the location of the project.

The FAQs will help educate you on how roads get built, road funding, who maintains our roads and our partners in road construction.
