## Fuquay-Varina Receives \$10 Million Grant Funding Two Key Transportation Projects

At the last Town Board meeting in December, N.C. Rep. Erin Paré presented a check in the amount of \$10 million in state grant funding to the Town of Fuquay-Varina. The \$10 million grant will be used for transportation improvements in Fuquay-Varina. The first \$1 million will go towards much-needed safety improvements at Johnson Pond Road/Whitted Street by constructing a Round-About. The remaining \$9 million will construct Wallace-Adcock Blvd., a new road linking NC 42 East to U.S. Hwy 401 North which will relieve congestion in the five-points area.

## Temporary Changes to Drinking Water March 1-31, 2022



Each year, the Town's water suppliers including Harnett County, Johnston County and the City of Raleigh temporarily change their water treatment process by suspending the use of ammonia. This disinfection process is a state-mandated practice to ensure safe

drinking water. Fuquay-Varina customers who use kidney dialysis machines and have fish aquariums should be aware that water may contain chlorine, ammonia, or a mixture of the two from March 1-31, 2022. The Town will also conduct flushing of the distribution system during this time. Customers may experience a slight discoloration of their drinking water.
