Global Manufacturer Begins Construction of New Facility



Global manufacturer CCL Label held a groundbreaking ceremony on Tuesday, June 20 to begin construction on a 110,000 square-foot plant bringing 150 new jobs and nearly \$34 million in investment to our community.

In 2021, CCL Label Inc., a subsidiary of CCL Industries Inc., purchased the Town's 32-acre business park. CCL Industries Inc. is the world's largest converter of pressure-sensitive and specialty extruded film materials for a wide range of decorative, instructional, functional, and security applications for government institutions and large global customers in consumer packaging, healthcare and chemicals, consumer electronic devices, and automotive markets.

In remarks made at the ceremony, Mayor Blake Massengill said, "The Town looks forward to growing our relationship with CCL Label and wants to be a valued partner in their success. I am certain Fuquay-Varina is a place CCL Label will be proud to call home."
